Introduction

The Datavideo VP-840 is an HDMI 1x4 Distribution Amplifier featuring the capability to repeat HDMI source to 4 displays simultaneously. The VP-840 supports data rate up to 18 Gpbs and resolutions of 4K2K@60Hz, and is compliant with HDMI 2.0 and HDCP 2.2.

The VP-840 features EDID management with auto downscale function, thus providing multiple EDID options for various output resolutions between all devices and ensuring that the HDMI source content is displayed correctly on the monitors.

Connections and Controls

The VP-840 comes in two different forms.

On the old model, the mode select switch and the firmware upgrade port are located on the right of the front panel. At the rear of the device, you should find one HDMI IN port at the center of the rear panel with each end having two HDMI OUTs. As for the new model, the mode select switch and the firmware upgrade port are on the left of the front panel. On the rear panel, the HDMI IN port is found on the left with all four HDMI OUTs sitting on the right of the HDMI IN.

In terms of functionalities, the new model is equipped with the auto downscale function which automatically adjusts the output resolution to the resolution acceptable by the connected monitor if the VP-840 is set to the EDID-1 mode, i.e. the automatic EDID learning mode. For example, if a 4K video source is connected to the HDMI IN port, then of the four HDMI outputs, two are connected of 4K monitors and two are connected of 1080p monitors, setting the VP-840 to the Auto EDID Analysis Learning Mode will allow the all four monitors to display the input video at the respective monitor resolutions. However, on the old model, only the 4K monitors will be able to display the input video and nothing will be displayed on the 1080p monitors.

In addition, the new and old models offer the user different firmware upgrade procedures. See relevant sections at the end of this manual for details.

Note: The extra pin of the mode select switch on the new model allows the user to switch between the normal operation and firmware upgrade modes. Whereas on the old model, the user is allowed to directly change the EDID setting without having to activate the working mode first.

EDID-1 Mode

Automatic EDID learning mode (EDID-1) detects all the connected HDMI monitors and analyzes the respective EDID contents. The EDID with minimal resolution support will be the reference EDID for incoming HDMI source players.


While connecting a new monitor to the VP-840 in mode 1 (Auto EDID Analysis Learning Mode), experiencing a short period of time without display might be expected. The VP-840 will do automatic EDID learning and generate the best Extended Display Identification Data (EDID) among all connected monitors.

EDID-8 Mode

To make sure the VP-840 is always configured to the EDID of the monitor with the lowest capability, simply plug the lowest resolution HDMI monitor to output port 1 and set the VP-840 to **mode 8 (EDID-8)**. Once the VP-840 is set to EDID-8, it will always learn the EDID information from output port 1.

To re-learn EDID from output port 1, please set the Mode Select switch to other modes and then switch to EDID-8 to trigger the learning mode.

EDID-1 Mode

Automatic EDID learning mode (EDID-1) detects all the connected HDMI monitors and analyzes the respective EDID contents. The EDID with minimal resolution support will be the reference EDID for incoming HDMI source players.


While connecting a new monitor to the VP-840 in mode 1 (Auto EDID Analysis Learning Mode), experiencing a short period of time without display might be expected. The VP-840 will do automatic EDID learning and generate the best Extended Display Identification Data (EDID) among all connected monitors.

EDID-8 Mode

To make sure the VP-840 is always configured to the EDID of the monitor with the lowest capability, simply plug the lowest resolution HDMI monitor to output port 1 and set the VP-840 to **mode 8 (EDID-8)**. Once the VP-840 is set to EDID-8, it will always learn the EDID information from output port 1.

Hardware Installation

Follow the steps outlined below to set up your VP-840 system.

- (1) Switch off all devices, including monitors.
- (2) Connect the output ports of the VP-840 to the displays.
- (3) Connect an HDMI source (such as a Blu-ray Disc player) to the VP-840 HDMI IN.
- (4) Plug in 12 V DC power adapter to the VP-840.
- (5) Set the Mode Select switch to the desired EDID mode.
- (6) Power ON the HDMI monitors.
- (7) Power ON the HDMI source.

Firmware Update

Datavideo usually releases new firmware containing new features or reported bug fixes from time to time. Customers can either download the VP-840 firmware as they wish or contact their local dealer or reseller for assistance.

This section outlines the firmware upgrade process which should take *approximately 10 minutes to complete*.

The existing VP-840 settings should persist through the *firmware upgrade process, which should not be interrupted once started* as this could result in a non-responsive unit.

Successful firmware upgrade on VP-840 requires:


- The latest firmware file, which can be obtained from your local Datavideo dealer or office.
- Mini-USB Cable
- Windows PC
- EPConsole UI

Firmware Upgrade Procedure (Old)

- Connect the USB Upgrade port of the VP-840 to the PC via a mini-USB cable. The USB Upgrade port can be found on the front panel of the VP-840.
- On the PC, open EP Console and depending on your system setup, select the detected COM port and set the Baud (recommended Baud is 57600 bps). In the example below, COM3 is the detected COM port.

 Click the FILE button to browse the hard drive for the firmware file. Double click the *.H00 file to import the firmware file, which should automatically bring in the *.H01 and *.H02 files.



 Press the F/W Upgrade button on the front panel of the VP-840 while connecting the 12V power adapter to the device.



- 5. Release the F/W Upgrade button approximately 5 seconds after the 12V power adapter is connected.
- 6. Click the Program MCU button (highlighted by a red rectangle shown in the diagram below) on the EP Console interface.

8. Power cycle the device to finish the firmware upgrade process.

Firmware Upgrade Procedure (New)

1. Set **PIN 1** of the mode select switch on the front panel to 1.



- Connect the F/W Upgrade port to the PC via a mini-USB cable then power ON the VP-840.
- 3. Download the firmware update zip file from the product page then unzip the file.
- 4. Double click the ITESHFU.exe file icon in the unzipped folder.
- As shown in the diagram below, the firmware will be automatically updated after the firmware update program is started.

6. The firmware update is complete when the text dialogue box shows **SUCCESS** and the program exits itself.





Frequently-Asked Questions


This section describes problems that you may encounter while using the **VP-840**. If you have questions, please refer to related sections and follow all the suggested solutions. If problem still exists, please contact your distributor or the service center.

No.	Problems	Solutions
1.	I cannot get output display on any of the monitors.	Try setting the VP-840 to EDID-7 or EDID-8. In the EDID-7 mode, as long as one of your monitors supports Full HD, the source video will be displayed successfully. In the EDID-8 mode, the VP- 840 will automatically learn the EDID information from output port 1. Please ensure that the lowest resolution monitor is connected to the output port 1.
2.	If the EDID mode is set to EDID-1 (Auto EDID learning), hot-plugging any HDMI output port will result in short signal loss at all other HDMI output ports. However, the video display will restore shortly after.	This is because the VP-840 needs to re-learn the EDID information.
3.	Resolution change sometimes results in image color distortion and loss of audio.	Disconnect and then reconnect the HDMI IN connection will restore correct video display.
